HDHS #1: Ser v. Estar

- Ser and estar may be two of the most confusing verbs, both mean "to be", but there are certain rules that will help you to know when to use them.
- The forms of ser and estar are:

PRONOUNS	SER	ESTAR
yo	soy	estoy
tú	eres	estás
él, ella, Ud.	es	está
nosotros (-as)	somos	estamos
ellos, ellas, Uds.	son	están

■ Ser is used to express <u>what</u> something is, while estar expresses <u>where</u> or <u>how</u> it is. Here is a list of the uses:

SER	ESTAR
time	location
origin	condition
characteristic	emotion

You might hear Mrs. Villanueva refer to them as:

"Tic – TOC" "The -TIONs"

TIME: Son las siete y media. LOCA**TION**: Estoy en la escuela.

ORIGIN: Yo soy de México. CONDI**TION**: La sopa está caliente.

CHARACTERISTIC: Él es alto. EMO**TION**: Estamos alegres.
