HDHS #4: Verbos con Cambios Radicales

- Some verbs are unique and have some spelling changes in the stem. The stem is the first part of the verb; the part of the verb that does not include the –ar, -er, or –ir. The only way to know if a verb is a stem-changer is by memorizing them.
- There is one rule to remember with present tense stem-changers: *All forms change <u>EXCEPT</u> nosotros!
- There are four types of stem-changers in the present tense.

 $E \rightarrow IE \qquad E \rightarrow I \qquad O \rightarrow UE \qquad U \rightarrow UE$

NOTE: $E \rightarrow I$ are must less common than $E \rightarrow IE$

■ Here's how they change...

yo pienso tú piensas él, ella, Ud. piensa pensamos ellos, ellas, Uds. piensan

yo duermo
tú duermes
él, ella, Ud. duerme
nosotros (as) dormimos
ellos, ellas, Uds. duermen

yo juego
tú juega
él, ella, Ud. juega
nosotros (as) jugamos
ellos, ellas, Uds. juegan

- So... If you wanted to say "I play soccer." You would normally think it is...
 Yo jugo fútbol.
 - BUT... that is <u>not</u> correct! Jugar is a stem-changer so the U becomes UE
 Yo <u>juego</u> fútbol.
- Some common stem-changing verbs are:

E → IE cerrar, empezar, entender, merendar, perder, preferir, querer servir, pedir, repetir
O → UE poder, volver, mover, contar, encontrar
jugar is the only U → UE
