HDHS #5: Comparativos

Comparatives are words and phrases that compare two or more nouns. They can show equality or inequality.

Inequality: Juana is taller than Juan. Equality: Juana is as tall as Juan.

In Spanish, inequality is expressed by using one of the following phrases:

more ___ than: más ___ que less ___ than: menos ___ que more than #: más de ... less than #: menos de ...

Examples:

Juana es más alta que Juan.

Juana is taller than Juana.

Juan is less tall than Juana.

Hay más de veinte estudiantes en la clase. There are more than 20 students in the class. Hay menos de veinte estudiantes en la clase. There are less than 20 students in the class.

In Spanish, equality is expressed by using one of the following phrases:

as ___ as: tan ___ como

as much ___ as: tanto (-a, -os, -as) ___ como

as much as: tanto como

Examples:

Juana es tan alta como Juan.

Juana is as tall as Juan.

Juan tiene tanto dinero como Juana.

Juan has as much money as Juana.

Sus estudiantes aprenden tanto como mis estudiantes. Her students learn as much as my students.

■ There are also a few irregular comparatives. These comparatives do not require the words más or menos.

older mayor better mejor younger menor worse peor

Examples:

Juana es mayor que Juan.

Juana is older than Juan.

Juana is older than Juana.

Juana is younger than Juana.

My dog is better than my cat.

My cat is worse than my dog.
